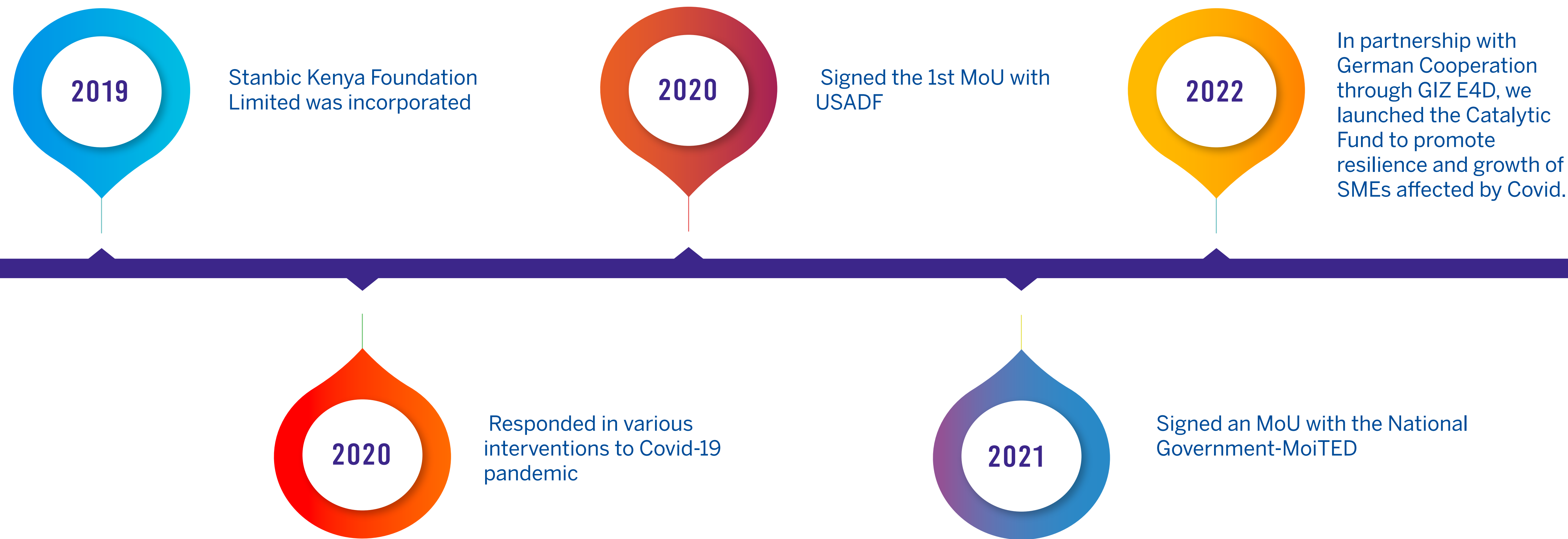

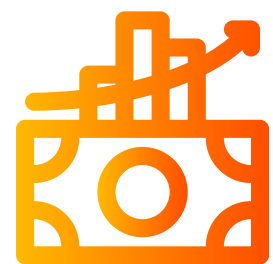


PARTNERSHIPS

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT



USADF (United States African Development Foundation) partnership with Stanbic Foundation

United States Africa Development Foundation (USADF) is an independent U.S. Government agency that supports and invests in African owned and led enterprises which improve lives and livelihoods in poor and vulnerable communities in Africa.

The USADF and SKF partnership Program was established in November 2020 following signing of an MOU. The 5-Year partnership is to support select SMEs for investment readiness through provision of grant capital and technical assistance. The Program was launched in July 2021 through the first call for applications. The call for applications resulted in hundreds of applications. This was followed by a shortlisting of 26 candidates for the pitch competition. The pitch competition provided a platform for the shortlisted candidates to present pitches for the grant fund. The seven finalists were ultimately chosen based on the G.I.V.E.S. criteria: Growth potential, Innovation and practicality, Viability of the proposal, Economic and special impact on communities, Strategy, and Entrepreneurial spirit.

USADF and Stanbic Kenya Foundation hosted two training sessions before the event to assist finalists in the preparation of their pitches, allowing participants to practice in an informal environment, receive feedback, and gain financial management skills. During the inaugural Pitch Event, participants each delivered a 15-minute verbal pitch that included basic elements of the businesses; problems the entrepreneurs face in accessing traditional commercial investment; proposed use of innovative techniques and technologies; any special focus on, or benefit to, youth, women, and girls; and the anticipated outcomes of the grant funding.

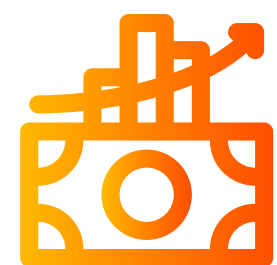

Stanbic Foundation and GIZ partnership



This partnership was established in Oct 2021 and the aim of this joint project is promoting resilience and growth of SME's affected by Covid through provision of access to finance, capacity building and coaching.

In Nov 2022 we signed another partnership to improve competitiveness and enhance business capacities of Blue economy MSMEs within preselected sectors in the blue economy zones i.e. fisheries and aquaculture, maritime security, maritime transport, tourism and logistics or vessel repair and maintenance.



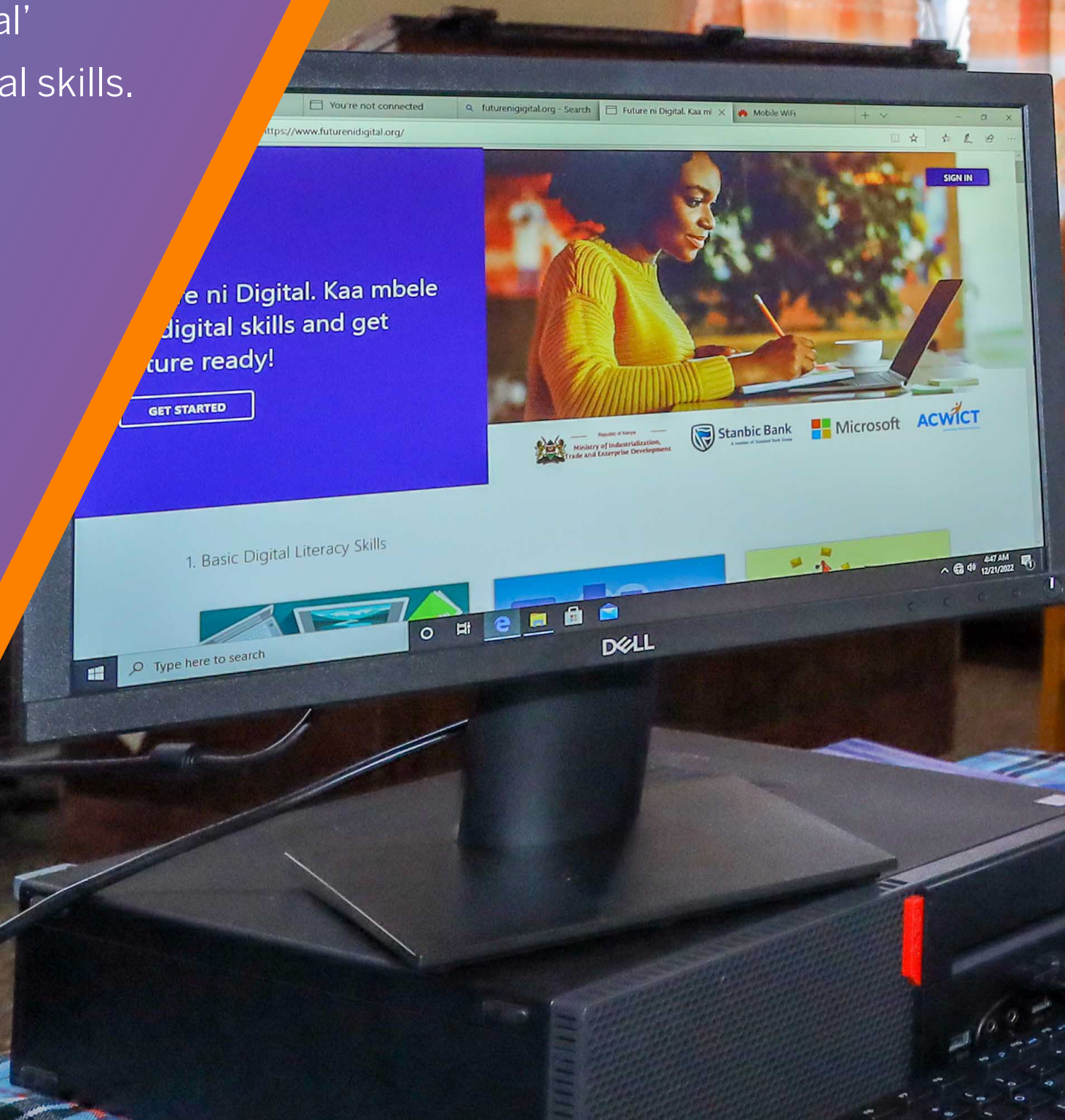
EDUCATION- DIGITAL LITERACY

One of the key pillars of the Stanbic Kenya Foundation is education. In the spirit of supporting Kenyans to upskill their digital skills, we have donated 593 desktops and laptops to various institutions such as County Governments where we have signed MoU's, Government Agencies, TVETs, schools, Kenya Prisons and Juba Prison Vocational Training. The donation is part of our 'Future ni Digital' program that aims to drive adoption and consumption of digital skills.

Gatina Primary School feeding partnership with Java House

Stanbic Kenya Foundation partnered with Java House Foundation to feed students at Gatina Primary School. Gatina Primary is a public school in Kawangware with a population of close to 1,200 children. The overwhelming majority of the students come from economically disenfranchised backgrounds, where basic needs like food are hardly met. We believe that health is key to education, thus the need to eradicate hunger. For some of these kids, these meals provided by Stanbic Foundation and Java Foundation are the only hot meals they get.

School feeding takes place every day of the week. Stanbic Staff participate in the feeding by serving the students on Fridays. Over 100 staff members from different units participated in the feeding in 2022

PalmHouse Foundation

Over the past 11 years, Stanbic has partnered with the Palmhouse Foundation to sponsor bright but disadvantaged students through their four years of secondary school education.

Palmhouse Foundation is an Education Trust that finances the secondary education of bright but disadvantaged students and offers them opportunities post-secondary education.

We have supported 56 students for 4 years of Secondary education.

Stanbic employees are involved in the selection process and constantly engaged in mentoring the students during the school holidays.

Population Services (PS)

Population Services Kenya is an organization that promotes the adoption and maintenance of healthy behaviours, as well as increasing access to and demand for high-quality health products and services.

Stanbic Foundation Kenya (SKF) partnered with Population Services (PS) Kenya to hold a series of cancer screening events targeting women in various areas of the country, while at the same time empowering them to self-screen themselves regularly.



Africa Cancer Foundation (ACF)

Africa Cancer Foundation (ACF) is a charitable trust that was launched in 2011 here in Kenya. The Foundation creates awareness on the prevention, management, and treatment of cancer in Africa.

Stanbic Foundation Kenya (SKF) partnered with Africa Cancer Foundation to offer free cancer screening, treatment, and education

Kisumu Medical and Educational Trust (KMET)

KMET is an indigenous Kisumu-based non-governmental organization established to promote quality in health and education services across Kenya.

Kisumu Medical and Educational Trust is an implementing partner of SKF in the effort to prevent Cervical Cancer. In addition to this, KMET also provides HPV vaccinations to teenage girls.
